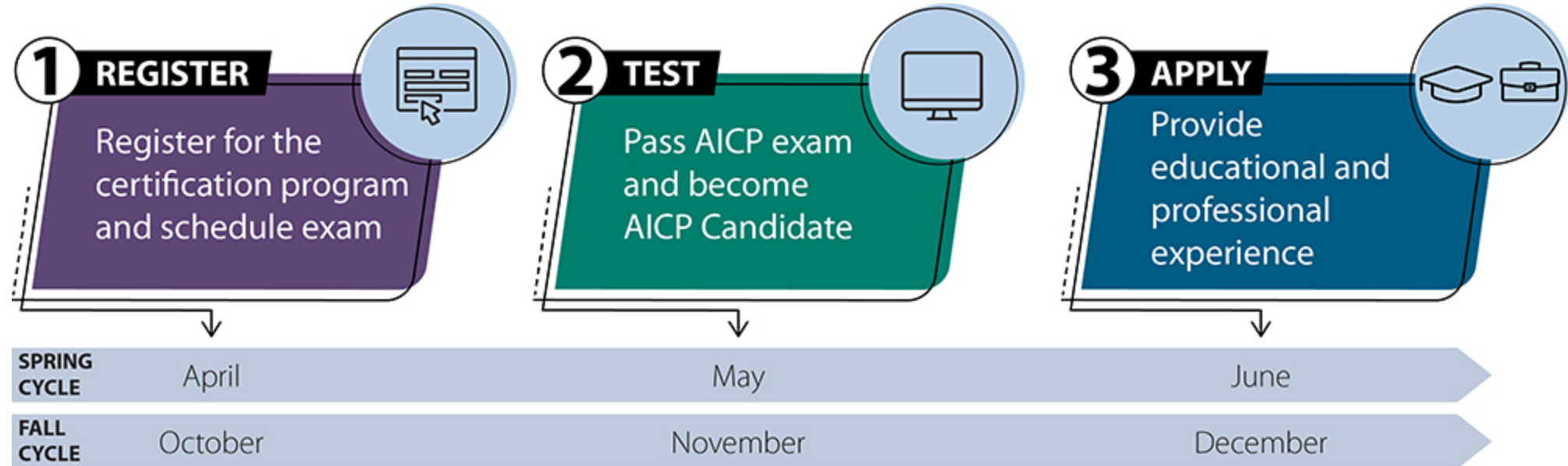

# Why AICP?

AICP Certification brings value to your career, the organization you work for, and the communities you serve. Certification demonstrates your expertise, shows your commitment to professional ethics, and helps to distinguish yourself in the job market.



# One Path to AICP Certification



TIP: Read the [AICP Certification Guide](#) about the whole certification process before registering for the exam!

# Step 1: Register and Schedule Exam

## Details

- Open to ALL APA members regardless of their education or experience
- Submit registration when prepared to test for upcoming exam
- Confirm understanding of requirements
- Agree to abide by the AICP Code of Ethics
- Schedule in-person or online remote exam appointment

# Step 2: Test

## Take Exam

## Pass and become AICP Candidate

## Details

- AICP Candidate designation used by all passing testers
- Must maintain APA membership to use the AICP Candidate designation
- Remain AICP Candidate until required minimum experience is earned

# Fall 2023 Cycle: NOW

## **STEP 1: REGISTRATION**

**Opens:** Monday, October 2, 2023 at 9:00am CST

**Closes:** Tuesday, October 31, 2023 at 3:00pm CST

**Transfer Deadline:** Monday, November 27, 2023 at 3:00pm CST

## **STEP 2: EXAM**

**Exam Window:** November 1–29, 2023

## **STEP 3: EXPERIENCE**

**Opens:** Monday, December 4, 2023 at 9:00am CST

**Closes:** Friday, December 29, 2023 at 3:00pm CST

# Spring 2023 Cycle

## **STEP 1: REGISTRATION**

**Opens:** Monday, April 1, 2024 at 9:00am CST

**Closes:** Tuesday, April 30, 2024 at 3:00pm CST

**Transfer Deadline:** Monday, May 27, 2024 at 3:00pm CST

## **STEP 2: EXAM**

**Exam Window:** May 1–30, 2024

## **STEP 3: EXPERIENCE**

**Opens:** Monday, June 3, 2024 at 9:00am CST

**Closes:** Thursday, June 27, 2024 at 3:00pm CST

Non-PAB Graduate degree in Planning <i>Checkbox to self-verify applicable <a href="#">knowledge areas of exam</a> in curriculum to ensure their program is planning</i>	3 years
Any other post-graduate, graduate, or undergraduate degree	4 years
No college degree	8 years

# Experience Assessment



## Same Certification Credibility



- The criteria for AICP Certification have not changed
- Provide education and employment history
- The Assessment allows you to demonstrate how your professional planning experience meets the criteria using:
  - **Checklists** to show how the entirety of your submitted experience meets the criteria requirements
  - **Open response fields** to provide a specific project example that demonstrates how your professional experience meets the criteria

# New Eligibility Pre-Check Resources

## **Planning Experience Worksheet**

Confirm your experience qualifies and meets AICP's definition of professional planning experience.

## **Interactive Experience Calculator**

Total up your years of professional planning experience to see how soon you can submit your Planning Experience Assessment.

## **Planning Curriculum Worksheet**

Confirm how much professional planning experience you'll be required to provide.

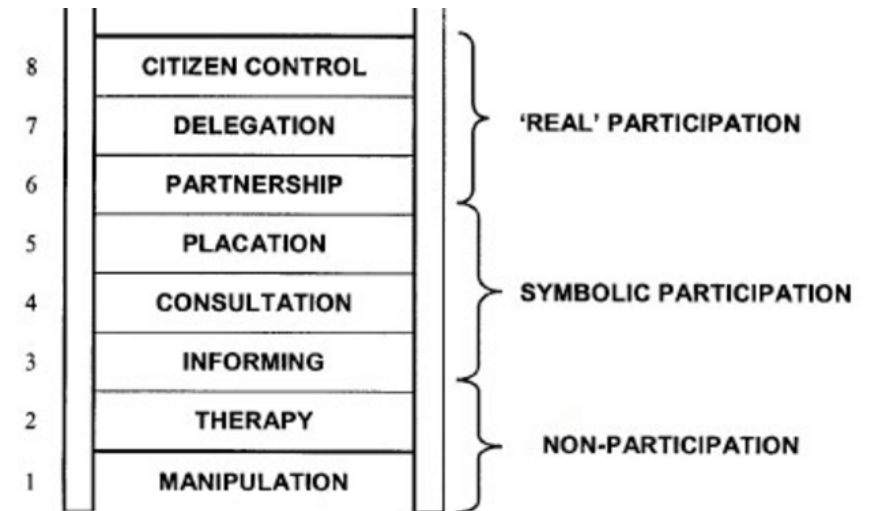

# Exam Prep: Tips

- Start early
- Understand APA
- Don't just memorize facts, understand the history and context
- Don't just rely on online quizzes (like planningprep and quizlet); make sure to read the source materials
- Study breadth, not depth
- Know material forwards and backwards
- Know how to perform basic planning calculations (SF to acre, calculate FAR, etc.)
- Use study habits that work for you
- Have fun!
